Community Partners

The Junior League of San Antonio supports over 60 other non-profit agencies annually by offering volunteers and necessary funding.

Our "San Antonio Works" projects provide a volunteer force of over 143 women, 3,317 service hours completed, that assist agencies such as the Leukemia Lymphoma Society, San Antonio Lighthouse for the Blind and Vision Impaired, Family Service Association and the Girl Scouts of Southwest Texas short-term (done-in-a-day) projects. The Junior League of San Antonio also works with children at Any Baby Children's Bereavement Center, the Boys & Girls Club, Sunshine Cottage School for

Deaf Children and the University Health System Foundation providing educational and enrichment activities for children of all ages throughout the year. community projects include reaching out to residents in local nursing homes, working Fairweather Lodge teaching life skills, doing activities and craft projects while developing relationships with the resident mothers & their children.

The Junior League of San Antonio hosted the Rummage Sale fundraiser and community service project for 93 years. This sale was a training ground for volunteers, raised substantial funds for Junior League of San Antonio community programs, provided а necessary service to the community by offering affordable clothing and other necessities for San Antonio families. In 2008, the League transitioned the Rummage Sale to a partnership with Goodwill. This partnership will allow the community aspect of the Rummage Sale to continue for years to come.

Whether through individual giving, corporate donations, or fundraising events, the Junior League of San Antonio raises funds every day to support our communith programs. Here is a look at how your contributions were invested back into the community.

- 10,224 SA Works hours have been completed, serving over 100,000 people..
- Our volunteers have tested approximately 5,844 SAISD students through our Prevent Blindness program, referring over 1,360 students
- The donations that have been made to Goodwill by the JLSA members, provided our community partners with over \$28,000 in gift cards to Goodwill stores
- We have given \$53,372 in awards and grants to various organizations that support our 9 pillars, not including a \$2,000 grant to Child Advocates of San Antonio (CASA). to underwrite the cost for Abby's Closet that funds the annual formal/semi-formal dress and accessories drive for female children in the foster care system, and \$8,000 in awards to F.A.M.E. winners.

Historically, the Junior League of San Antonio has demonstrated leadership and involvement in a wide range of community programs and support of a wide range of public issues. As part of its community involvement, the Junior League of San Antonio has identified a number of broad public issues which affect our community. Family Preservation


The Junior League of San Antonio supports efforts which foster a greater sense of self-esteem and personal responsibility so that individuals, families, and communities are strengthened.
